

Procedure Log

Purpose

An Emergency Medicine Procedure log is required of all residents. The Residency Management System (New Innovations) allows tracking of all procedures performed. PA residents are responsible for the entry and accuracy of this information. The following are the core procedures that need to be documented.

Responsibilities

The following procedures must be documented in the residency procedure log.

- Arterial lines
- Bedside Ultrasound
- Cardiac pacing
- Cardioversion
- Central venous access
- Chest tubes
- Cricothyrotomy
- Digital block
- Dislocation reduction
- Epistaxis control
- Laceration repair
- I & D
- Intubations
- IO Placement
- Joint and soft tissue aspiration
- Lumbar puncture
- Pericardiocentesis
- Procedural sedation
- Slit lamp exam
- Medical, adult and pediatric resuscitations
- Trauma, adult and pediatric resuscitations

The procedure log is located at www.new-innov.com. PA residents are responsible for tracking and entering their procedures. Procedures done during the procedure lab, simulation, workshops, small groups, or in other venues should also be entered in the log.

Ultrasounds are tracked separately through the US machines, EPIC and logbook.
